PROVIDERS: The courses that are submitted have been approved for 2 years. You only have to submit a new application and supporting documents if:

- If the course content, title, or the amount of hours offered changes
- If you would like to continue offering a particular course after the 2-year expiration date
- If you have a new request for course approval *

We do not list these by the date of the course. You can offer the course anytime during the 2 year approval period. You DO NOT have to request approval when offering the course any additional dates or locations.

***FOR COURSE APPROVAL:** Please submit, with all new requests, a Continuing Education Application, course syllabus or outline, a vitae of all instructors and (if applicable) a letter verifying the speakers affiliation with an appropriate educational institution.

Please let the Board office know if you are NOT offering the course any longer and we will take it off the list. At the end of a renewal period, your approved courses will be transferred to the list for the current renewal period for the remainder of their 2 year time period.
